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Statewide Programs

US DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE (USDA), SINGLE FAMILY HOUSING REPAIR LOANS AND GRANTS

The Single Family Housing Repair Loans and Grants program provides loans to income-eligible homeowners in eligible rural areas to repair, improve, or modernize their homes. This program may also provide grants to elderly income-eligible homeowners in eligible rural areas to remove health and safety hazards.

WHAT IS AVAILABLE TO HOMEOWNERS?

- The maximum loan amount is \$40,000 to be repaid over 20 years with a fixed interest rate at 1%.
- The maximum grant amount and lifetime limit is \$10,000 and must be repaid if the property is sold in less than three years.
- Loans and grants can be combined for up to \$50,000.

LOAN AND GRANT ELIGIBILITY

- The home must be owner-occupied;
- You must be unable to obtain affordable credit elsewhere;
- You must have a household income that does not exceed the <u>very-low-income</u> <u>limit.</u>
- In the case of grants, you must be age 62 or older.

WHAT IS AN ELIGIBLE RURAL AREA?

Utilizing the <u>USDA Eligibility Site</u>, you can enter a specific address for determination or just search the map to review general eligible areas.

ILLINOIS HOMEOWNER ASSISTANCE FUND HOME REPAIR PROGRAM (HAFHR)

*Elevate is a grantee of the HAHFR Program. ILSFA participants are not required or expected to go through Elevate to access this grant.

The Illinois Homeowner Assistance Fund Home Repair Program (HAFHR) allows eligible homeowners to address home maintenance needs that were delayed and exacerbated due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Eligible repairs will maintain the habitability of a home and prevent homeowner displacement. Those who received HAF housing assistance are eligible to apply. The home repair grants will carry a 3-year forgivable recapture agreement. Funding and organizational capacity are limited, and many grantees have a waiting list for applicants.

WHAT IS AVAILABLE TO HOMEOWNERS?

• HAFHR granted awards to selected grantees to make eligible critical home repairs up to \$60,000 per household.

ELIGIBILITY

- Homeowner must be at or below 150% AMI based on household size.
- Households must certify a financial hardship after January 21, 2020 related to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Must own and occupy the home.
- Must meet any additional eligibility requirements determined by the grantee.

Home Rehabilitation Accessibility Program (HRAP)

The Home Rehabilitation Accessibility Program (HRAP) provides forgivable loans for rehabilitation work for health, safety, and accessibility improvements on the homeowner's property. This may include basic structural repairs, roof, doors, windows, electrical, heating, and more improvements. Contact your local administrator of the program to check for available improvements.

WHAT IS AVAILABLE TO HOMEOWNERS?

- Up to \$45,000 per unit for all types of rehabilitation work.
- Up to \$21,500 for the roof-only option.
- Assistance in the form of a 5- or 3-year forgivable loan.

ELIGIBILITY

- Homeowners at or below 80% of the <u>Area Median Income (AMI)</u> for the household size.
- Must be a single-family home.

A network of grantees administers the Home Rehabilitation Accessibility Program across Illinois. The approximate grant period runs from March 2023 through March 2025. Please note that funding and organizational capacity is limited, and many grantees will have a waiting list for applicants. Due to limited program funding, not all eligible households will receive funding. Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) for Housing Rehabilitation

Through the Housing and Urban Development (HUD) department and the Illinois Department of Commerce & Economic Opportunity (DCEO), communities across the state have been granted CGBG funding for home repairs.

AREAS WITH AVAILABLE CDBG FUNDING: ARLINGTON HEIGHTS - SINGLE FAMILY REHABILITATION LOAN PROGRAM

The purpose of the Single Family Rehabilitation Loan Program is to assist low- and moderate-income homeowners with needed home repairs. Loans can be used to correct code violations, replace old furnaces and water heaters, repair or replace roofs, increase energy efficiency, make accessibility improvements for disabled persons, and more.

WHAT IS AVAILABLE TO HOMEOWNERS?

The amount of financial assistance will be determined by the Village. The minimum loan amount per home is \$2,000 and the maximum loan amount per home is \$25,000. No interest is charged. There are no monthly payments.

AURORA - THE SAFETY FIRST PROGRAM

Eligible repairs include mechanical, electrical and plumbing systems; roof and porch repairs or replacements. Repairs must deal with the safety of your home. <u>Click here</u> for the application.

WHAT IS AVAILABLE TO HOMEOWNERS?

Eligible City of Aurora homeowners may receive funding for certain home repairs up to \$4,999 in the form of a 3-year forgivable loan to correct emergency or life and safety hazards in their home.

For some repairs, up to \$5,000 of additional funding may be available in the form of a 0% deferred loan (which is not forgiven after 3 years, but does not need to be paid back until the home is sold or a cash-out re-finance occurs).

This assistance will be in the form of a grant with a maximum funding amount of \$4,999.00 and is eligible to one (1) and

two (2) unit owner-occupied properties where the applicants current total household income is considered to be low-to-moderate as defined by the Federal Department of Housing & Urban Development.

NAPERVILLE - SINGLE FAMILY HOME REPAIR GRANT PROGRAM

The City of Naperville has contracted with <u>Rebuilding Together Aurora</u> to provide nocost, home safety and accessibility modifications for low-income homeowners. The Single-Family Home Repair Program is open to households located within the municipal boundaries of the City of Naperville.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Property must be owner-occupied and be the primary residence of an elderly person, a person with disabilities, a veteran, or children under 18 living in unhealthy or unsafe conditions.
- Income must fall below 80% of HUD low-income standards.
- Homeowner must not be able to do necessary repairs/modifications due to cost or physical constraints.

NORMAL - HOMEOWNER HOUSING REHABILITATION PROGRAM

The Emergency Repair and Home Modification programs are available to owneroccupants of single-family homes that meet HUD's annual income guidelines. The property must be located within the corporate limits of the Town of Normal. Additional homeowner and property eligibility criteria may apply. Homeowners interested in the program can complete the <u>Eligibility Screening Tool</u>.

WHAT IS AVAILABLE TO HOMEOWNERS?

The maximum available assistance varies by program and housing construction type. Assistance is provided through either a grant, 5-year forgivable loan, or 10-year forgivable loan.

SINGLE-FAMILY REHABILITATION LOANS & GRANTS

Residents of Oak Park with qualifying incomes (household incomes at or below 80% AMI) who own and live in single-family houses are eligible for home rehabilitation home loans. For more information, please see the <u>Program Information Flyer</u>.

WHAT IS AVAILABLE TO HOMEOWNERS?

- **Deferred-payment, no-interest loans:** For low-income owners, loans of up to \$25,000 repayable after 20 years.
- Emergency loans: No-interest loans of up to \$5,000 repayable after 5 years to correct single emergencies and emergency code violations such as furnace replacement.

SMALL RENTAL REHABILITATION LOAN

The Small Rental Rehabilitation Loan uses CDBG funds to rehabilitate affordable rental housing units.

WHAT IS AVAILABLE TO HOMEOWNERS?

• A minimum project budget is \$2,000 per rental unit and the maximum is up to \$5,000 per rental unit inclusive of contingency. Priority is given to applications with units having three or more bedrooms.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Property owners are required to commit or leverage a minimum 25 percent of the total project cost.
- Property owners must abide by all terms of the forgivable mortgage and the Small Rental Rehabilitation Program Loan Commitment and Agreement for five years.
- The maximum rent charged cannot exceed the most current rent limits published by HUD for the Chicago/Naperville/Joliet area depending on the income level of the applicant.

RANTOUL - HOUSING REHABILITATION ASSISTANCE

The city of Rantoul has several home repair programs available to residents.

MAJOR REHABILITATION DEFERRED LOAN PROGRAM

Assistance up to \$20,000 is available for major repair or renovation of homes which contain several *code-related* issues or are in need of significant rehabilitation (cosmetic items do not qualify). The funds are applied as a 5-year forgivable mortgage on the home.

MINOR REHBILITATION GRANT PROGRAM

Under this program a grant of up to \$12,000 is provided for *code-related* repairs of an emergency nature which threatens the health or safety of the occupants of the home.

ACCESSIBILITY GRANT PROGRAM

Provides grant assistance to an income-eligible homeowner or renter of a single-family residence or up to a four-unit complex to eliminate physical barriers which inhibit the use of the dwelling unit by a person with Disability. The maximum grant amount is \$7,000.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- You own and have lived in your home in Rantoul a minimum of one (1) year
- You meet general requirements related to cost of construction, zoning, etc.
- The sum of all liens and mortgages on your home do not exceed 95% of your home's value.
- You and your household do not exceed the <u>HUD income limitations</u>.

ROCK ISLAND - HOUSING REHABILITATION PROGRAMS

The Housing Rehabilitation Programs provides forgivable loans to income qualifying applicants and is only available to City residents who own their house. There are currently three program: General, TARRP, and Emergency.

WAITLIST

The waitlist for these programs is about 1.5 - 2 years long.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Applicant must live in and own the property they are applying for.
- Applicant must have owned the property for at least six months prior to the time of application.
- Total household adjusted gross income must fall within the established income limits.
- Property taxes must be current.
- Utility bills due to the City cannot be delinquent.



- Property must have homeowner's insurance.
- Applicant must be a legal US citizen or resident.

MINOR HOME REPAIR PROGRAM

The City grants CDBG funds for emergency correction of building code deficiencies and other minor repairs of single-family, owner-occupied dwellings to improve the condition of housing stock and keep homes safe and affordable. Examples of items which may be repaired are condemned furnaces, faulty wiring, or actively leaking roofs.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

• The applicant must have owned and lived in the property for at least one year;



- Contract-for-Deed purchasers are not eligible;
- The applicant's property must not have had prior assistance under this program;
- The property must be located within Springfield city limits;
- The applicant must meet income guidelines.

MAJOR HOME REPAIR PROGRAM

The City uses available HOME funds to subsidize the code rehabilitation of single-family dwelling units owned by qualifying low to moderate income families or individuals with a zero percent, deferred, forgivable loan; within low-income census tracts. This program's purpose is to improve the condition of housing stock and keep homes safe and affordable.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- The applicant must have owned and lived in the property for at least one year;
- Contract-for-Deed purchasers are not eligible;
- The applicant's property must not have had prior assistance under this program;
- The property must be located within one of the following LMI Census Tracts: 2.02, 3, 6-9, 13-19, 23-26, 27, 28.01 and 28.02;
- The applicant must meet income guidelines.

ST. CLAIR COUNTY

St. Clair County has several home repair programs for residents.

HOUSING REHABILITATION LOAN PROGRAM

This program makes loans available to eligible low to moderate income persons to rehabilitate single-family owner-occupied homes in participating St. Clair County communities. Up to \$7,000 at 2.5 percent interest is available.

EMERGENCY REPAIRS PROGRAM

Provides funds up to \$5,000 per household to eligible low-income persons for the purpose of addressing any items that threaten the health or safety of the resident (i.e. roof, electric, plumbing, heating).

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Homes must be single-family owner-occupied properties in participating St. Clair County Communities.
- Total Gross Household Incomes cannot exceed 50% of area median.
- Proof of gross household income; ownership/residence; paid real estate taxes; insurance required to qualify.

URBANA - HOME REHABILITATION GRANT PROGRAM

The City of Urbana has various home rehabilitation grants available to income-qualified residents. These grants include:

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Only properties within the corporate limits of Urbana are eligible to participate in these programs.
- Household income may not exceed 80% of area MFI (median family income) limits.
- Homes to be rehabilitated must be structurally sound and relatively free of any building deficiencies that would render the property "substandard."

The Senior Emergency Home Repair Program provides for emergency related health and safety home repair assistance for low-income homeowners, 65 years of age or older and/or physically disabled and 55 years of age or older. The City of East St. Louis, TIF Department offers home repair grant opportunities citywide for a limited number of seniors, who reside within the City of East St. Louis. Applicants must meet low-income guidelines and be owner occupants. The maximum Senior Emergency Repair Grant is up to \$5,000. Grants are used to correct serious code violations and/or emergency repairs.

- Applicant must be very low income.
- Applicant must own and occupy the home.
- Applicant must not have received a prior rehab/repair grant from City Programs.

MURPHYSBORO REHABILITATION/DEMOLITIAN LOAN POLICY

The City of Murphysboro Rehabilitation Loan Program serves the real property community within the corporate limits of Murphysboro by providing the opportunity for responsible property owners to either rehabilitate their personal residences if practical and feasible or to demolish the structure if it poses safety risks as outlined by city ordinance.

ELIGIBILITY

- Deed to the property must be in the Applicant's name. Property must be within the corporate limits of Murphysboro.
- The maximum loan request shall be \$5,000.
- Applicants must submit the following information:
 - Loan application (provided by the City)
 - Authorization for credit history/background check (costs to be paid by the applicant)



- Interest rate to be used for all Rehabilitation/Demolition Revolving Loans shall be equivalent to the current weighted average rate of the City's Certificates of Deposit plus 50 basis points.
- Calculations for loan interest shall be based on an "Actual/365" method.
- If loan is approved and funds are advanced, borrower will agree to all a lien in favor of the City of Murphysboro to secure subject property until debt is extinguished.

- Homeowners must be current on property taxes;
- Homeowners must have homeowner's insurance;
- Homeowners must meet relevant underwriting criteria;
- Annual GROSS household income (i.e. the combined pre-tax income from all sources for all members of the household) cannot exceed the <u>limits listed</u>. Income limits are based on household size.
