










Opportunity (DCEO)

What is the Climate and Equitable Jobs Act (CEJA)?

Comprehensive energy legislation that centers equity and puts Illinois on track to achieve 100 % renewable energy by 2050.




FEJA Workforce Training Program

Equity Investment Eligible Communities (EIEC)

Priority provided to projects taking place in or serving EIECs

These regions have been centers of historic disinvestment, high rates of violence, and/or suffered the highest rates of negative environmental impacts.

Equitable Energy Future Grant Program (EEF)

Award Information

\$25.5 million annually in pre-development funding for renewable energy and/or energy efficiency projects. Awards range \$250k - \$1 million.

Eligible Applicants:

- Illinois Power Agency certified Equity Eligible Contractors
- Business, non-profit, or cooperative organization that meets equity building criteria based on submitted CEJA Ecosystem Utilization Plan (CEUP).






Breakdown of Application Denials Round 2



Eligible Applicants:

- Community-based Organizations (CBOs)
- A public entity (if no CBO in the surrounding community has the ability/capacity)
- Technical service provider in partnership with a CBO





Energy Transition Community Grant (ETCG)

Award Information

Minimum of \$50,000 per grantee, plus additional funds based on a grant formula that considers job and revenue loss.

Eligible Applicants:


• Local units of government within 30 miles of a closed or closing fossil fuel, nuclear, or coal mine /mine. Including municipalities, counties, school districts, or other taxing districts.

Opens annually. Closed June 2025.


